Phonics in Year 1 2022/2023

This booklet is aimed to help parents when supporting their child with phonics in Year 1, preparing for the phonics screening check in the week commencing 12th June 2023.

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1. Introduction

What is phonics?

Children begin to learn phonics in Early Years, both in Nursery and Reception.

At Rivelin, we teach early reading and spelling using the systematic, synthetic phonics programme "Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised". This is a programmed that has been validated by the Department for Education.


Phonics is making the connection between the sounds of our spoken words and the letters that are used to write them down.



How does it work in Year 1?

Children are taught a new GPC daily, in discrete 30 minute phonics sessions. All the GPCs taught are practised in words, sentences, and later on, in fully decodable books. Children review and revise GPCs and words, daily, weekly and across terms and years, in order to move this knowledge into their long-term memory.

Children are also taught the spellings for tricky words (high frequency words that cannot always be decoded using phonics) to aid their fluency in reading and writing.







2. Phonics screening check

Who takes the test?

All children in Year 1. If for any reason, we feel that there is a valid reason why your child should not take the test in Year 1, the class teacher will discuss this with you. This is only done in exceptional circumstances and your child would still be eligible to take the retake when they are in Year 2.

What is it?

This will further inform our continual assessment of the children's phonic knowledge and the results of the check will be shared with parents/carers in the end of year report.

It comprises of a list of 40 words that children read one-to-one with their teacher. The list is a combination of both real and 'alien words' which rely purely on using phonics to decode. The pseudo-words or 'alien words' are words that have been made up and will be shown with a picture of an imaginary creature to help them.



After the check

We will tell you about your child's progress in phonics and their screening check score as part of the end of year report. If your child has found the check difficult, we will also tell you what support we have put in place to help them improve. You might like to ask your child's class teacher how you can support your child to take the next step in reading but it is important to

remember that all children are individuals and develop at different rates.

3. Helping your child with phonics

What can you do?

Phonics works best when children are given plenty of encouragement and learn to enjoy reading and books.

Here are some simple ways you can help:

1. Read with (and to) your child every day. Grandparents and older brothers or sisters can help too.



2. Choose 4 sounds a week to display at home that your child is unfamiliar with.

3. Practise real and alien words with your child.**



4. Use the grow the code chart*. Point to a sound and ask your child to say the sound.

5. When reading, encourage your child to 'sound talk'

(segment) unfamiliar words and then blend the sounds together from left to right, rather than guessing from the pictures. 6. Encourage your child to read words from your shopping list or road signs to practise phonics.

7. Word games like 'I-Spy' can also be an enjoyable way of helping children.

4. Useful phonics vocabulary

Phoneme – a single unit of sound in a word.

Grapheme – a way of writing down a phoneme. This could be a single letter, e.g. 't', or a sequence of letters, such as 'ai'.

GPC – Grapheme Phoneme Correspondence. Knowing a GPC means being able to match a phoneme to a grapheme and vice versa.

Digraph — two letters representing one sound (phoneme), e.g. ch, sh, ng, qu, ai, ee.

Trigraph — three letters representing one sound (phoneme), e.g. air, igh, ear.

Segment — hearing a word and breaking it down into the different sounds to spell the word, e.g. bench → b-e-n-ch

Blend – put the sounds back together to read a word, e.g. b-e-n-ch \rightarrow bench

CVC - 3 sounds in the pattern of consonant, vowel, consonant, e.g. cat, dog, pen, ship.
