This year's SATs tests will take place next week (Monday 12th May to Thursday 15th May).

During this week, children will sit tests in:

- Spelling, Punctuation and grammar
- Reading
- Maths

Wednesday 14 th May 2025	Mathematics papers 1 and 2
Thursday 15 th May 2025	Mathematics paper 3

How will Key Stage 2 SATs be marked?

All the tests will be sent away to be externally marked. Schools will be informed of pupils' standardised scores for the above tests. In order to achieve the expected standard at the end of Key Stage 2, your child will need to achieve a standardised score of 100. Your child's results will be shared with you in the end of year report.

How can you support your child?

It is essential that your child attend school every day and is on time. We will be hosting Y6 breakfast club next week (Monday-Friday) from 8:00am each morning. This will provide your child with the opportunity to eat some more breakfast and relax with friends prior to tests, which will begin after morning registration. If your child is interested in attending, please ensure that they are at the main gate (next to the library) from 8:00am so that the teacher can collect your child.

We are incredibly proud of all our Year 6 pupils for their hard work and dedication in completing their SATs next week. To celebrate their efforts, we will be treating the children to a pizza lunch on **Thursday** as a well-deserved reward.
